RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Quimby, Round, Haley and Ross Ponds.

Fishing in Quimby, Round, Haley and Ross ponds regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to close Quimby, Round, Haley and Ross Ponds, in the town of Rangeley in Franklin county to all fishing except fly fishing with a daily bag limit of 6 fish per person under the rules and regulations. No trout less than 8 inches or salmon less than 14 inches shall be killed.
