AN ACT Relating to Quarantine of Indigent Cases.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S. c. 22, additional.** Chapter 22 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after § 55 thereof the following new section:

‘§ 55-A. **When indigent resident of another town is quarantined, notice to be sent to responsible town.** Whenever the local health officer, or, if there is none, any selectman is informed that a person who is a charge on another town is suspected of having a communicable or infectious disease, he shall notify the town or towns that may be charged with the expenses necessary for his care within ten days.’
