Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Hunting of wild hares and rabbits regulated. Section 71 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof :

There shall be a closed season from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of the following September, both days inclusive. During the open season it shall be unlawful for any person to shoot, take, kill or have in possession more than 4 rabbits in any one day or at any one time. No person shall set or use any snares or traps or any other device in the hunting of wild hares or rabbits or hunt the same in any except the ordinary method of shooting with guns ; provided, further, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to transport or offer for transportation at any time any wild hares or rabbits beyond the limits of the state ; provided, further, it shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession or transport at any time any wild hares or rabbits taken in closed season or by any method or with any device prohibited by this section.
