RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Heald Ponds.

Fishing in Heald Ponds, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill, any kind of fish at any time, in Heald Ponds, in Caratunk Plantation, in Somerset county, except it shall be lawful to fish in said ponds in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly fishing, so-called, during the open season under the general law; provided, it shall be lawful for any person to catch and kill more than 10 fish in all in any 1 day in said ponds or more than 5 pounds of fish in all, unless the last fish taken increases the combined weight thereof to more than 5 pounds.
