STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Relating to Burial of the Dead.

Rules and regulations of bureau of health, amended. Resolved: That the commissioner of health and welfare is hereby directed to make the following change in the rules and regulations of the department for the transportation of the dead, so that sub-section C of § 3 of the said rules and regulations shall read as follows:

'C. Bodies dead of any disease not mentioned in Section 2, which are not to be transported by public or private conveyance, ~~must be thoroughly embalmed with an approved disinfectant fluid or buried within twenty-four hours after death.~~ shall be buried under the directions of a licensed undertaker or embalmer.'
