STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT relating to Fishing in Carrabasset River.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Amending Fishing Law Carrabasset River. That part of section 21 of chapter 38, being the first biennial revision of the fish and game laws relating to regulating fishing in the Carrabasset river enacted into law by chapter 277 § 59 of the public laws of 1931 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Carrabasset river (1931, c. 277, § 59), and in all tributaries, direct and indirect, above the falls at East New Portland, except in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly-fishing, so-called, with the following further exceptions: (a) the main stream of the West Branch of said Carrabasset river, exclusive of tributaries thereto, up as far as, and including those parts of Dead and Quick streams, so-called, which are below the road leading from Salem to Phillips, and Lemon stream, shall be open to plug or bait fishing; and (b) it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in Dead and Quick streams, so-called, above the road leading from Salem to Phillips, or in as much of the north branch of the Carrabasset river as lies above the bridges at Bigelow on the road leading from Kingfield to Stratton:'
