STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Construction of Georges Valley Pike.

Georges Valley Pike, construction of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$30,000 for the construction of the road beginning at R. No. 1 in Thomaston about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of the state prison, at Walker's corner, so-called, and running through the town of Warren on east side of Georges river, through Union, to R. No. 101 to Barrett's Corner, so-called, thence along west side of St. Georges river and Senebec Pond through the towns of Appleton and Searsmont, into Belmont as far as R. No. 102; being about $5\frac{3}{4}$ miles.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This piece of road is the only unimproved section in 40 miles of road.
