## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to Business and Recreation Prohibited on the Lord's Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S. 1930, sec. 39, c. 135; relative to business and recreation prohibited on the Lord's day, amended.** Section 39 of chapter 135 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 39. Regulation of business and recreation on Sunday. It shall be unlawful on the Lord's day to keep open any store; use any sport, game or recreation; or to be present at any dancing, public diversion, show or entertainment, encouraging the same. Whoever violates this section shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$10.00, provided however that this section shall not apply to the keeping open of news stands, restaurants, garages and drug stores; to the selling of gasoline; to the keeping open of tobacco stores, fruit stores, confectionery stores and ice cream parlors which confine their business to same; the giving of scientific, philosophical, religious or educational lectures where no admission is charged but a collection is allowable; or to the holding of amateur sports which will be considered those sports where the players receive no compensation for their services, and where no admission is charged but a collection is allowable for the benefit of clubs staging amateur sports, and where said sports are not held between the hours of 10 A. M. and 1 P. M.'
