STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT to Authorize the Town of Bristol to Raise Money for the Purpose of Helping Keep in Repair the Cemeteries in Said Town.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Authorized to raise money for care of cemeteries; how expended. The inhabitants of the town of Bristol, a municipal corporation in the county of Lincoln, are hereby authorized to raise money, under an appropriate article in the town warrant, to help keep in good repair and condition all monuments, headstones, markers and graves in any or all of the cemeteries of said town and also to keep all bushes and grass cut and the trees and shrubs properly trimmed. The sums so raised may be expended by the said town or its servants or agents or by a committee consisting of citizens thereof, and any church organization or society interested in keeping such burving ground in proper condition and repair.
