IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

AN ACT to Amend "An Act Relating to the Control of the State Department of Health Over Plumbing."

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L. 1931, c. 235, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 235 of the public laws of 1931 is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 121A. Cities and towns may prescribe plumbing regulations. Such permits shall be issued on the payment of a fee of not less than 50 cents for each such permit but not more than \$1 per fixture, up to a total of five fixtures; for over five fixtures not less than ten cents and not more than 30 cents shall be charged for each additional fixture, as shall be determined by such ordinance or by-law. ~~One third of the amount of such fees shall be paid through the state department of health to the state treasurer to be maintained as a permanent fund and used by the state department of health for the carrying out of the provisions of section 121 and section 121B.~~ The remainder amount of such fees shall be paid to the treasury of the city or town and used exclusively for carrying out the plumbing laws in such cities or towns. Fixtures for the purposes of this chapter shall be defined as: receptacles intended to receive and discharge water, liquid, or water carried wastes into a drainage system with which they are connected.

The department shall hold hearings on the first Tuesdays of February, and August of each year or oftener if deemed advisable for the purpose of considering changes in the rules and regulations pertaining to plumbing.'
