STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to Non-residents Kindling Fires and Employment of Guides.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S. c. 38, § 51, amended. Section 51 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof :

‘Sec. 51. Kindling of fires by non-residents regulated. Non-residents shall not kindle fires upon any unorganized township, while engaged in camping, fishing or hunting during the months of May to November first, without being in charge of a registered guide, except, at public camp sites maintained by the Maine Forestry Department. No guide shall at the same time guide or be employed by more than five non-residents in hunting.’
