AN ACT Relative to Traverse Jurors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S. c. 120, § 7, amended. Section 7 of c. 120 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows :

'Sec. 7. Rule by which clerk shall issue venire. The grand and traverse jurors shall be drawn from each jury district in such manner as to cause jurors, at each term of court, to come from every part of the county as equally as may be, and so far as practicable, from every town in rotation, having regard to the number of its inhabitants, taking not more than 2 grand jurors and two traverse jurors from the same town at the same time, unless from necessity, or some extraordinary cause, or to equalize the service; and the clerk of courts shall issue venires to the constables of towns and organized plantations, and the constables, marshals and deputy marshals of cities accordingly. **At no time shall more than 24 traverse jurors be allowed to be in attendance and receive pay for their services on any day except the first day of any term of the superior courts excepting in some extraordinary cause as above mentioned.'**
