STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to Closed Season on Bear.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 38, § 72, amended. Section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby repealed in that portion as set forth in the first biennial revision of the fish and game laws as sub-paragraph (c) of section 72, and the following enacted in place thereof:

The black bear is hereby classified as a game animal with an open season within the Maine forestry district corresponding to the open season on deer. Bear may be taken at any time outside the Maine forestry district by any person on land owned by him, and provided further, that the state shall not be liable for any damage to orchards, sheep or other property by bear.
