IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

AN ACT Relating to Referees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 96, § 94, amended. Section 94 of chapter 96 of the revised statutes hereby is amended by adding at the end thereof the following: 'except that, when acting as such referee, no fees or compensation, in addition to his salary, shall be received from the county, any party in interest, or otherwise, by any justice or retired justice of the supreme judicial or superior courts', so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sec. 94. Court may appoint referees. In all cases in the supreme judicial or in the superior court in which the parties agree that the same may be tried by one or more persons as referees, the court may appoint the same, not exceeding three, whose fees and necessary expenses shall be paid by the county on presentation of the proper certificate of the clerk of courts for that county, and the amount thereof shall be fixed by the court upon the coming in of the report, **except that, when acting as such referee, no fees or compensation, in addition to his salary, shall be received from the county, any party in interest, or otherwise, by any justice or retired justice of the supreme judicial or superior courts.'**
