STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to the Classification, Registration, and Fees of Guides.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 38, § 16. Section 16 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Applicants for registration as guides must be citizens of the United States and shall apply in writing to the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, setting forth in his application whether he desires to be registered as a Class A or Class B guide; and the commissioner may, upon sufficient proof as to his competency, register such person as a Class A or Class B guide. No person shall be issued a Class A guide's certificate unless he is physically, mentally and morally capable of guiding and caring for a party anywhere in the forests or on the waters of the state and said commissioner may, at his discretion, promote or demote guides from one class to another. A fee of \$3.00 shall be paid annually for the registration of a Class A guide and a fee of \$1.00 shall be paid annually for a Class B guide. Non-residents may be so licensed for restricted areas upon payment of a fee of \$20.00.

'Whenever a guide registered, as provided in this section is charged with having violated any of the inland fish and game laws, the commissioner may suspend his certificate of registration.'
