JOINT ORDER Relative to Investigation Department of Education.

Ordered, the Senate concurring, that

A committee of nine be appointed, three on the part of the Senate by the President thereof, and six on the part of the House, by the Speaker thereof, to make a survey of all state operated and all state subsidized schools, including the University of Maine, for the purpose of determining where possible curtailment of activities can be made without necessarily working any hardship upon education, and for the further purpose of reducing the cost of the Department of Education.

The committee shall take into consideration revision of all salaries, increases in tuition, enlargement of area districts with the view of reducing the number of superintendencies and any other matters pertaining to the department of education which it might think advisable to look into.

The Department of Education is hereby directed to cooperate with this committee by furnishing it with all the data and information at its disposal.

This committee shall start working as soon after the present session of the legislature as possible and shall report to the next session of the legislature not later than the second week in January.

All necessary expenses of this committee up to an amount not exceeding \$500.00 shall be paid by the state.
