STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, for Screening Pierce Pond, in the County of Hancock.

Pierce Pond to be screened. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$115.50, to be taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to aid in the screening of Pierce Pond, located in the town of Penobscot, in the county of Hancock; provided, however, that said appropriation shall not be available until some responsible person, corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of the lake or pond above mentioned is situated, or some other town in the county of Hancock, in which said waters are situated, shall have agreed to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same; and provided further that the state shall be liable for only one-half of the cost of said screen.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

A group of interested citizens in the locality where Pierce Pond is located, headed by Ralph Wardwell, of Castine, have raised the money necessary to screen said Pond, the actual cost of which was \$231. The work has been done, and now these citizens are asking that a resolve be passed appropriating one-half of the amount expended, \$115.50, to reimburse them for one-half the cost of said screen.
