AN ACT Relating to Hunting of Moose.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S. c. 38, § 60, amended.** Section 60 of c. 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

**‘Sec. 60. Hunting of moose and caribou prohibited; exception; permission shall be received before importation.** No person shall hunt or have in his possession any caribou or moose, or parts thereof; **except that it shall be lawful to hunt moose in the counties of Knox and Washington during the last week in November.**

Provided, however, that the commissioner of inland fisheries and game upon application of any person who has legally killed a caribou or moose beyond the limits of this state may issue a license permitting the importation of such caribou or moose for consumption or mounting, but not for sale.’
