STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Hunting of Skunks and Raccoons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 38, § 72, paragraph (d), amended. Paragraph (d) of § 72 of c. 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Electric flash light may be used. (d) Provided, that it shall be lawful to hunt skunks and raccoons at night when accompanied by a dog and using a rifle not larger than the regular 22 caliber (the 22 caliber hi-power being hereby expressly prohibited), or a shotgun not larger than 12 gauge, using not larger than No. 2 shot, and a kerosene light, from the first day of October of each year to the fifteenth day of the following December, both days inclusive, only in the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, York, Sagadahoc, Kennebec, Lincoln, Waldo, Knox and Oxford; providing, however that an electric flash light of not more than 3 cells may be used in addition to a kerosene light while locating in a tree and taking raccoon treed by a dog.'
