STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Forty Hour Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 54, amended. Chapter 54 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section 40 of said section a new section to be numbered 40-A, and to read as follows:

'Sec. 40-A. 40 hour limit in industrial establishments. No person shall be employed in any industrial or manufacturing establishment, in the state more than 40 hours, or 5 days, in any one week, and not more than 8 hours in any one day.'
