A N A C T R e l a t i n g t o B o u n t y o n C r o w s .

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Bounty on crows. The treasurers of cities and towns are hereby authorized to pay a bounty of 10c a head on all crows killed from April 1 to July 31, both days inclusive, to an amount not exceeding \$50 in any one year. Heads of crows shall be delivered to the city or town clerk as proof of slaughter, and shall be by them destroyed. No person shall enter upon the property of another for the purpose of killing crows without having first obtained the permission of the land owner, under a penalty of \$5. Towns and cities shall be reimbursed by the state from revenue derived from game licenses.
