A N A C T A u t h o r i z i n g C r e m a t i o n o f B o d i e s o f t h e D e a d .

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

Cremation of dead bodies. Any person, firm or corporation within the state, with the approval of the department of health and welfare of said state, may establish and maintain suitable buildings and appliances for the cremation of bodies of the dead, and subject to such regulations as said department may from time to time make, may cremate such bodies and dispose of the ashes of the same.
