STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians.

Penobscot tribe of Indians, care and maintenance. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated from the state treasury to be expended, under the direction of the governor and council by the bureau of social welfare of the department of health and welfare for the benefit of the Penobscot tribe of Indians for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1934, and for the year ending June 30, 1935 as follows:

And be it further resolved, that any balance of any of the sub-divisions above named and not required for the purpose, may, upon recommendation of the state auditor, be transferred by the governor and council to pay bills against any of the above sub-divisions, where bills may have been contracted in excess of the amount above set forth.
