AN ACT Relating to Trapping of Muskrats.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**R. S. c. 38, § 72, amended.** Sub-section (a) of section 72 of chapter 38, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended to read as follows :

‘(a) Provided that there shall be an annual closed season on muskrat in the counties of Androscoggin, Cumberland, York, ~~Sagadahoc~~, Kennebec, Lincoln, Waldo and Knox from the 21st day of April of each year to the 19th day of March of the following year, both days inclusive; and provided that there shall be annual closed seasons on muskrat in the counties of Washington, Hancock Aroostook, Penobscot, Piscataquis, Franklin, Somerset and Oxford from the 1st day of December of each year to the 31st day of March of the following year, both days inclusive, and from the first day of May to the 31st day of October following, both days inclusive; and provided further that in Sagadahoc county that there be an annual closed season from the 1st day of February to the 15th day of November, both days inclusive.’
