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AN ACT Relating to the Conduct and Licensing of Recreational Camps,  
Tourist Homes and Similar Places.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Chapter 36, additional.** Chapter 36 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto two new sections, to be numbered 31 and 32, and to read as follows:

**'Sec. 31. Certain provisions applicable.** The provisions of sections 22, 23, 24, 25 and 26 of this chapter, shall from the date of the legal approval of this amendment, become applicable and effective as to recreational camps, tourist homes and similar places, as well as to hotels, inns and lodging houses.

**Sec. 32. State highway police, additional duties.** It shall be the duty of the state highway police in addition to their duties, to make regular inspections of the registers of all recreational camps, tourist homes and similar places, to the end that it may be determined whether such places are being conducted in accordance with the law as herein amended, and in the event that they are not, then said officers shall begin prosecutions for violations thereof. This visitation and inspection shall be made by each officer along his line of operation regularly.'
