AN ACT to Define the Pauper Status of Indians.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Indians cannot acquire pauper settlements. An Indian, or his wife or minor children, shall not be deemed to have a pauper settlement in any town in the state. A person having the habits and appearance of an Indian shall be deemed to be an Indian.
