## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to Application for Parole by Convicts in State Prison.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 147, § 29, amended. Section 29 of chapter 147 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 29. Application for parole; action thereon by board of prison commissioners. Application shall be made to the board of prison commissioners, upon uniform blanks prescribed by them, or to the warden of the prison. The warden when requested by a prisoner whose minimum term of imprisonment with the deduction provided by law has expired and who is eligible to parole, shall furnish such prisoner with a blank application for parole. The application shall be filled out and delivered to the warden who shall immediately forward the same to the board of prison commissioners with his recommendation indorsed thereon. Upon receipt of such application and recommendation, the board of prison commissioners shall make such investigation in the matter as they may deem advisable and necessary, and may, in their discretion, grant such application and issue a parole or permit to such applicant to go at large without the enclosures of the prison.'
