## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Fees for Jurors.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas present financial conditions demand that stringent economy in state government be exercised, and

Whereas, in the judgment of this legislature, every reasonable effort be made to this end, and

Whereas, in the judgment of this legislature, these facts constitute an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of the state of Maine and therefore require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Jurors' fees. Section 6 of chapter 126 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

**'Sec. 6.** Fees of jurors. Grand and traverse jurors, attending the superior court, and jurors attending on any other occasion prescribed by law, shall be allowed \$4.00 a day for their attendance, Sundays and holidays excepted, and six cents a mile for their travel out and home, to be paid out of the county treasury.'

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency set forth in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
