AN ACT Relating to Pauper Settlement.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S. c. 33, § 3, amended.** Section 3 of chapter 33 of the revised statutes as amended is hereby amended to read as follows:

**'Sec. 3. Settlements shall remain until new ones are acquired, or until lost under provisions of this section.** Settlements acquired under existing laws, remain until new ones are acquired or until lost under the provisions of this section. Former settlements are defeated by the acquisition of new ones. Whenever a person **of capacity to acquire a settlement**, having a pauper settlement in a town, has lived, or shall live, for **five consecutive** years in any unincorporated place or places in the state, or five consecutive years outside of the town in which he has a settlement after August 1, 1926, without receiving pauper supplies from any source within the state, he and those who derive their settlement from him lose their settlement in such town, and whenever a person having a pauper settlement in any town in the state shall after April 29, 1893, live for 5 consecutive years beyond the limits of the state without receiving pauper supplies from any source within the state, he and those who derive their settlement from him shall lose their settlement in such town. **The state shall be deemed to be liable for support of such persons.** A person in the military or naval service of the United States shall be deemed to be a resident of the town in which he was a resident at the time of his enlistment or induction.'
