STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Concerning Property Exempt from Attachment and Execution.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S. c. 95, § 67, ¶¶ I and 2, amended. Sub-paragraphs I and II of section 67 of chapter 95 of the revised statutes are hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 67. Personal property. The following personal property is exempt from attachment and execution.
- I. The debtor's apparel; household furniture necessary for himself, wife, and children not exceeding one two hundred dollars in value, and one bed, bedstead, and necessary bedding for every two such persons.
- II. All family portraits, Bibles, and schoolbooks in actual use in the family; one copy of the statutes of the state, and a library not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars in value, a watch not exceeding ten dollars in value, and a wedding or engagement ring not exceeding ten dollars in value.
