AN ACT Relating to Judges of Probate.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 75, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 75 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

‘Sec. 3. Judges, how selected; terms commence, when. Judges of probate are elected or appointed as provided in the constitution. **Only attorneys at law admitted to the general practice of law in this state and resident therein may be elected or appointed as judges of probate.** Their election is effected and determined as is provided respecting county commissioners; and they enter upon the discharge of their duties on the first day of January following; but, when appointed to fill vacancies, their terms commence on their appointment.’
