RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Georgia M. Sproul of Liberty.

Pension provided for Georgia M. Sproul. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Georgia M. Sproul, of Liberty, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Georgia M. Sproul is the daughter of Jason Wier who served in Company A, 7th Infantry, Maine Vols., and Company H, 1st Veteran Infantry, during the Civil War. His service was from January 29, 1864, to July 22, 1865. Mrs. Sproul is a widow, 64 years of age, and in poor health. Her husband was sick two years, and practically all of their savings were used for his care. She owns a farm, valued at \$1,000.00, but it is a long way from a railroad and for that reason she finds it difficult to sell it. She is very much in need of assistance and is worthy of receiving it.
