RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Emma J. Brown of Belfast.

---

**Pension provided for Emma J. Brown.** Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Emma J. Brown, of Belfast, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Emma J. Brown is the daughter of Daniel S. Robertson who served in Co. A, Coast Guard Reg. of Inf., Maine Vols., during the Civil War. His service was from March 18, 1864, to May 26, 1866. She is 63 years of age and without home or property. She is not able to earn enough for her comfortable support, and her children are not financially able to take care of her.
