STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Ida S. James of Randolph.

Pension provided for Ida S. James. Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Ida S. James, of Randolph, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ida S. James is the daughter of John F. Blodgett who enlisted September 10, 1862, mustered October 11, 1862, a Private in Co. H, 21st Inf., Maine Vols. He reenlisted February 18, 1865, was mustered February 20, 1865, in 4th Battery, Light Artillery, and was honorably discharged June 17, 1865. Mrs. James is a widow, 68 years of age and in very poor health. Her children are doing what they can to assist her but are not financially able to furnish her with comfortable support, and she is in need of a little additional help.
