IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Ida G. Reed, of Pittston.

Pension provided for Ida G. Reed. Resolved: That a pension of \$10 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Ida G. Reed, of Pittston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions, for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ida G. Reed is the daughter of Chas. B. Mansir, who served in Co. G, 30th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War, and died in 1864 while home on a furlough. Mrs. Reed was only 6 years of age at the time of her father's death, and would be entitled to a pension under the general law, but the maximum amount which can be allowed on account of the service of a Civil War Veteran has been apportioned to her brother, who was also a minor at the time of the Veteran's death.

Mrs. Reed is now 75 years of age, a widow, and dependent upon her son for support. This son is now out of employment, and the family is having a hard time to get along. She is deserving of assistance.
