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RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Grace Griffin,  
of Auburn.

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**Pension granted to Grace Griffin.** Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Grace Griffin of Auburn, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension which she is now receiving.

### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Grace Griffin is the daughter of James Nelligan who served in Co. B, 12th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War.

She was granted a pension of \$6.00 per month by Chapter 76, of the Resolves of 1927. She is crippled on account of a broken leg, and her health is very poor, and she is in a destitute condition. She is in urgent need of further assistance.
