STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a Survey of Proposed Game Preserve in Hancock County.

Survey authorized of proposed game preserve. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed and authorized to make a survey and study through his warden service of the value to the state as a game preserve of the property of Neva Ethel Austin and her sister. In case the said commissioner shall decide that the property is desirable, he shall report the same to the governor and council who are hereby authorized to accept a deed for the same in behalf of the state, reserving to the said Neva Ethel Austin and her sister, a joint life estate therein, and conditioned on the grantors' use of the life estate tax-free.

The said property herein referred to being located in the town of Hancock and Township No. 8, in the county of Hancock.

On the acceptance of such a deed by the state, the commissioner of inland fisheries and game shall declare the above named property a game preserve under the rules and regulations of the department, and shall have charge of the property for the state, and see to its preservation and care.
