## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the West Bath Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 88, amended. Section 88 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 88. West Bath. From the time this act becomes effective, no person shall at any time hunt, trap, catch, pursue, shoot at, or kill any wild animal, or bird, (except bebeats, Canada lynx, foxes, rabbits, minks, skunks, or ducks), within the following described territory situated in the town of West Bath in the county of Sagadahoc: Beginning on the east bank of the New Meadows river at a point due west of the northwest corner of the cottage dwelling of Samuel R. Percy at Sabino, so-called; thence running easterly to the Sabino road; thence easterly by said Sabino road to Prince's corner, so-called; thence southerly by the Campbell's pond road and Brigham's cove road to Brigham's cove in Winnegance Bay; thence southerly, westerly and northerly by the shore of said Winnegance Bay and said New Meadows river to the point of beginning. The territory herein above described shall be known, and in any proceedings under this section may be designated as the West Bath Game Preserve. It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time within the period aforesaid any wild animal, alive or dead, or any wild bird taken or killed in violation of any provision of this section.

Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 nor more than \$100 and costs for each offense, or by imprisonment for 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
