STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Susie May Harding of Hampden.

Pension provided for Susie May Harding. Resolved: That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Susie May Harding, of Hampden, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Susie May Harding is the daughter of Samuel R. Stevens who served in Co. K, First Maine Regiment, during the Civil War. His service was from May 25, 1864, to June 28, 1865. Mrs. Harding is 60 years of age and her husband is 77. He is not able to work and they are in a very destitute condition. They have no relatives able to assist them.
