STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Leland Palmer of Carmel.

Pension provided for Leland Palmer. Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Leland Palmer, of Carmel, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Leland Palmer is the son of Dennis W. Palmer who enlisted December 30, 1863, in Co. A, 1st Maine Cavalry, and was mustered out and honorably discharged August 1, 1865. He is 63 years of age, and has a disabled hand and arm, which makes it impossible to earn a sufficient amount for the support of himself, and his wife and child who are dependent upon him.
