IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Hannah L. Batchelor of Belfast.

Hannah L. Batchelor; pension for. Resolved: That a pension of \$12.00 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Hannah L. Bachelor, of Belfast, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Hannah L. Batchelor is the daughter of Stephen G. Inman, who served in Co. K, 8th Reg. of Inf., Maine Vols., during the Civil War. He enlisted September 6, 1861, was mustered into service September 7, 1861, and served until January 18, 1866. She is now 75 years of age. She has no relatives and is without property of any kind. She is being supported by private charity, but the friends who have been assisting her are not financially able to continue doing so, and she is in urgent need of help.
