STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Ellen Bird of Farmingdale.

Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Ellen Bird, of Farmingdale, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension which she is now receiving.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Ellen Bird is the daughter of Edward Bird who served in Company I, 24th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War, and was honorably discharged. She was granted a pension of \$8.00 per month under the provisions of Chapter 98 of the Resolves of 1931. She is aged and feeble and unable to work and this amount is not sufficient for her needs. She is in a destitute condition and is worthy of receiving further assistance.
