#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Katherine L. Prescott, of Wilton.

Katherine L. Prescott; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is granted to Katherine L. Prescott of Wilton, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Katherine L. Prescott is a woman seventy-three years of age, the daughter of George H. Davis who was a private in the 8th Regiment of Maine Volunteers.

Mrs. Prescott's husband died in 1928, leaving her without any means of support and with no living children. She has two brothers, one who was in the Civil War, living in Pasadena, California, and the other brother living in Bristol, Connecticut, neither of whom are able to give her any assistance.

· Mrs. Prescott's health is poor and she is unable to support herself.
