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RESOLVE, Providing State Pension for Hattie A. Harris, of Auburn.

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**Hattie A. Harris; state pension. Resolved:** That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Hattie A. Harris, of Auburn, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

Hattie A. Harris is a daughter of William Bickerton, deceased, who served in the Civil War as a volunteer from Maine, and who received an honorable discharge. She is a widow with no one upon whom she can depend for support. She is unable to work, and has no means of supporting herself, and will become a pauper charge on the city of Auburn, as she has her legal settlement in that city, unless she receives aid from the state.
