STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Olive E. Brann of Augusta.

Pension of Olive E. Brann, of Augusta, increased. Resolved: That a pension of \$20.00 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Olive E. Brann, of Augusta, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension she is now receiving.

STATEENT OF FACTS

Olive E. Brann is the daughter of Alvin A. Banks who served in the Civil War. He was wounded in service and also served time in Libby Prison.

Mrs. Brann was granted a state pension of \$15.00 per month by chapter 98 of the resolves of 1931, but this amount is not sufficient for her needs. She is advanced in years and in poor health. Richard H. Stubbs, M. D., of Augusta, is treating her for a severe case of anaemia, and J. Frederick Hill, M. D., of Waterville, is treating her for serious eye trouble.
