STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Nellie E. Hatch, of Monmouth.

Nellie E. Hatch; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Nellie E. Hatch, of Monmouth, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Nellie E. Hatch is the daughter of Joseph H. Coffin who enlisted October 9, 1861, in Company G, First Cavalry, Maine Volunteers, and was mustered out and honorably discharged, a Corporal, November 25, 1864.

Mrs. Hatch is now 66 years of age and has had poor health practically all of her life. In September, 1932, she submitted to a serious surgical operation and her complete recovery is doubtful. On account of sickness, she has been under heavy expense for many years, and is now badly in need of financial assistance and is worthy of receiving it.
