IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-
THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Archibald Mullen of
Washington.

Pension provided for Archibald Mullen. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Archibald Mullen, of Washington, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Archibald Mullen is the son of Archa Mullen who enlisted September 10, 1862, in Company A, 26th Maine Infantry, and was mustered out and honorably discharged August 31, 1863. He is 76 years of age, and cannot earn a sufficient amount for his own support and the support of his wife who is dependent upon him. He is worthy of assistance.
