STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Back Bay Sanctuary, in the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 85, amended. Section 85 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes as amended, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 85. Back Bay Sanctuary. No person shall at any time, hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any water fowl or any other wild bird in Back Bay, so-called, in Portland, in the county of Cumberland, above the Grand Trunk Railway bridge. No person shall have in possession at any time any water fowl or any other wild bird or any wild animal, or part thereof, taken in violation of any provision of this section. Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10, nor more than \$40 and costs, for each offense.
