STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Fred Witham, of Washington.

Fred Witham; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$8 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Fred Witham, of Washington, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Fred Witham is the son of James Witham who enlisted Feb. 11, 1865, in Co. A, 15th Maine Inf., and served until Feb. 14, 1866, when he was honorably discharged. He is 65 years of age, and in very poor health. He is not able to earn a sufficient amount for his comfortable support, and is having a hard time to get along. He is worthy of assistance.
