STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Certain Non-resident Operators and Exempting from Registration Certain Vehicles Owned by Non-residents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 29, § 40, paragraph (a), amended. Paragraph (a) of section 40 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- '(a) The provisions of this chapter relative to the registration of motor vehicles, tractors, and trailers, and the granting of operators' licenses shall not apply to a motor vehicle, tractor or trailer owned by a non-resident, other than a foreign corporation doing business in this state, or to a non-resident operator other than the operator of any such vehicle belonging to a foreign corporation doing business in this state, provided that the owner of such vehicle has complied with the provisions of law of the state or country of his residence relative to the registration of such vehicle and provided said operator has complied with the provisions of law of the state or country of his residence relative to operators' licenses. But this exemption regarding operators' licenses shall not apply to any operator resident in any other state or country whose laws do not require such operators' licenses. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to permit a non-resident vehicle having a weight in excess of or equipped contrary

to that allowed a similar resident vehicle, to be operated on the ways of this state.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 29, § 41, 4th paragraph, amended. The 4th paragraph of section 41 of chapter 29 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Third. Any passenger bus bringing into the state persons as ε single organized group or party for whose exclusive use such bus has been chartered and is so used, and which is chartered and intended to be used solely as a continuous means of conveyance for such group of persons for one round trip only per year while they are touring in the state. No owner or lessee of any such bus shall be entitled to so use or operate enother such bus in this state during the same year except on payment of the registration fees required in other eases for like vehicles. But upon entering the state The operator of each such bus shall obtain from the secretary of state, or some of his agents or inspectors, a permit describing and identifying the vehicle and he shall pay therefor a fee of ten dollars. Said permit shall state the date of issuance, and thereon shall be printed a copy of this paragraph.'
